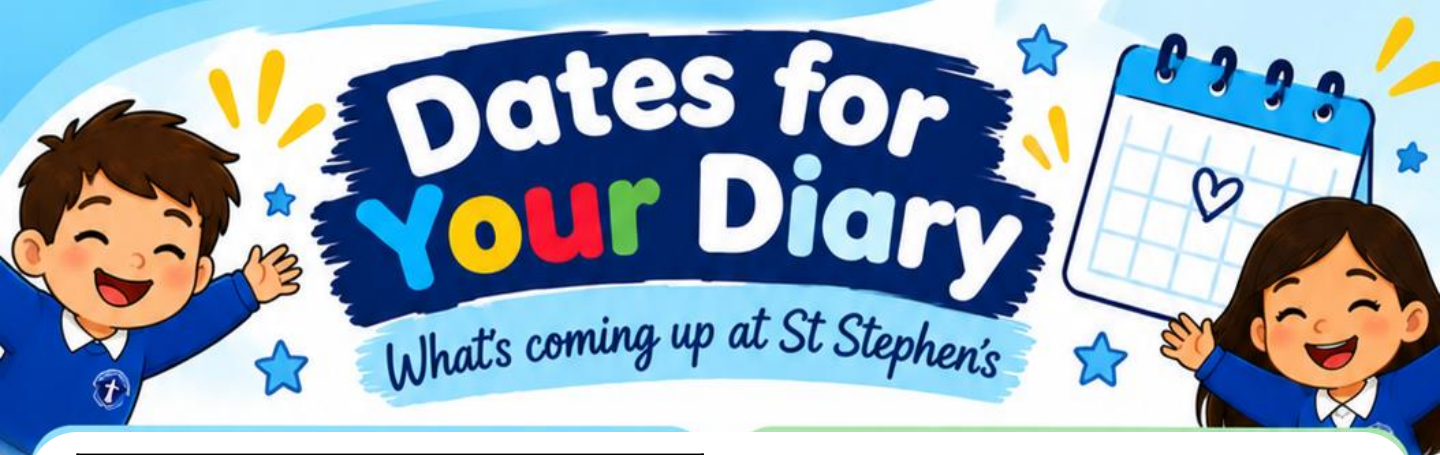

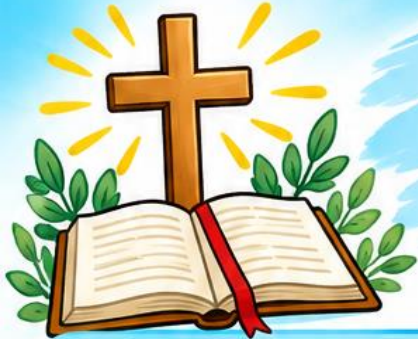

Nursery



We have had a lovely week of learning in Nursery!

In phonics, we have enjoyed singing "Wind the Bobbin Up" and listening carefully to sounds in our environment and to different animal sounds. In maths, we have been identifying red, blue and yellow and spotting these colours in the world around us, from yellow Manchester buses and daffodils to red post boxes and ladybirds. We have also loved singing our number rhyme, "1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Once I Caught a Fish Alive".

Our story this week was *Peepo!*; the children enjoyed retelling the main events and talking about what the baby could see. In RE, we explored our outdoor area and went on a nature walk to discover the wonderful world God has made, finding lots of things that made us say "Wow!" The children have also been saying our lunchtime and end-of-day prayers beautifully and practising the sign of the cross. To finish the week, we enjoyed European Languages Day, learning about Spanish culture, the red and yellow Spanish flag, dance and patterns.



Reception



It has been another lovely week in Reception and the children have continued to settle into our routines and enjoy their learning.

We have been innovating our story *Monkey Puzzle*. The children have enjoyed changing the main character from a monkey to a butterfly and thinking about how this changes the story. We have been developing our storytelling skills and using our imaginations to create our own ideas.

In maths, we have been learning how to sort objects by size and colour. The children have been practising looking carefully at objects and explaining why they belong in a particular group.

In RE, we have continued exploring the Creation story. We have been thinking about all the wonderful things God created and taking time to thank God for the beautiful world around us. Well done to all the children for another fantastic week!

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Year 1

It has been another busy week in Year 1! In Maths, we have been learning to find one more and one less within 10 and practising counting forwards and backwards to 20. In English, the children completed an independent write using their "I can see..." sentences. In Science, we have been learning what plants need to grow, and the children planted their own seeds which we will observe and care for over the next few weeks. In R.E., we have been thinking about being thankful for God's wonderful creation and considering what we can pray for. In History, we explored how life for people living and working in a castle was different from the life of the king. For Spanish Day, we looked at Spanish homes and architecture and enjoyed decorating our own azulejo tiles.

Year 2

Be Positive ♥ Be Respectful ♥ Be Your Best



This week has been another busy one in Year 2! On Friday, we celebrated European Languages Day, with our class theme being Spain. The children learned about traditional Spanish markets and enjoyed taste-testing a selection of Spanish fruits and vegetables, which was a fantastic way to explore another culture. In English, we have begun writing our independent recount based on I Want My Hat Back, applying our learning about simple sentence structure, capital letters and full stops. In Maths, we have been counting in tens and ones and using pictorial representations to help us understand place value. In History, we explored the different methods used to put out the Great Fire of London and discussed why some were more effective than others. In RE, we continued our work on the story of Noah, retelling the story before writing our own stewardship poems inspired by the poem *Hurt No Living Thing*.

It has been another busy yet enjoyable week in Year 3. Today, for European Languages Day, we studied the work of Antoni Gaudi and enjoyed making our own Gaudi-inspired chameleon mosaic originally in Parc Guell in Barcelona.

In Maths, we have continued our work on place value, looking at different pairs of 2-digit numbers which total 100 using Base 10 to support our understanding. In English, we completed our first independent write of the year, planning and writing a diary entry from the point of view of the Stone Age boy using statements, exclamations, questions and commands. The pieces of writing produced by the children have been very impressive!

In History, we explored Stone Age hunter-gatherers and thought about the challenges faced by Stone Age people to survive. Finally, in RE, we looked at the Catholic Social Teaching principle of Human Dignity, and how we can show this in our day-to-day lives.

What a fantastic week we have had in Year 4! In Guided Reading, the children became text detectives, exploring a non-fiction text about unusual hobbies and used evidence from the text to answer retrieval questions. In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of column subtraction, including regrouping across place value columns. In History, we became historians, analysing a range of sources to discover what the Ancient Egyptians believed about the afterlife. In Religion, we explored the covenant between Abram and God, carefully analysing scripture before creating our own visual representations and artwork to show our understanding. Today, we also enjoyed European Languages Day, where the children learned about Spanish music and even had a go at some flamenco dancing!

It has been a busy and exciting week, with lots of brilliant learning and enthusiasm.

What a fantastic week of learning in Year 5! In English, the children have been independently planning, writing, editing and publishing their own exciting story blurbs inspired by the pictures from *The Mysteries* of Harris Burdick. They have used a fantastic range of writing features to capture the reader's attention, build an intriguing setting and leave us desperate to read on with a cliffhanger! Excellent writing, Year 5! In Maths, we have been exploring hundredths and place value, using manipulatives to help us understand the value of each digit. We have been finding hundredths of numbers, exploring what happens when we multiply by 100, and practising counting in multiples of hundredths.

In RE, we explored God's Ten Commandments and discussed how, as God's children, we can follow these commandments and use them to guide our choices and actions.

In History, we have continued our fascinating learning about Mayan culture and society. We investigated the hierarchy within Mayan society, explored their homes and discovered more about the foods they ate, including foods that we still enjoy today! The children also examined a range of historical sources, carefully recording what they could see and thinking about what these sources can tell us about Mayan life. Well done, Year 5, for another brilliant week of learning! We are so proud of your hard work, curiosity and creativity!

It has been another fantastic week in Year 6, with the children demonstrating their creativity, resilience and maturity across the curriculum.

In English, the children have completed their independent recounts, retelling the story of *Lava* from the whale's point of view. They worked hard to incorporate multi-clause sentences and powerful vocabulary, and we were incredibly impressed with the quality of their writing.

In Maths, the children have completed their consolidation of the four operations and have been developing their ability to apply their mathematical knowledge to problem-solving. This has involved using their understanding of bar models, and how to use them to solve magic square and data problems.

In RE, we explored the story of the Fall of Man and Woman in Genesis. The children analysed a range of artwork depicting the story and thoughtfully considered the messages surrounding persuasion and temptation.

Finally, on Wednesday, a number of children bravely stood up in front of their peers to deliver their Head Boy and Head Girl speeches. We were absolutely blown away by the effort, confidence and thought that went into each speech. They truly showcased what an amazing and special cohort of children we have in Year 6, and we could not be prouder of them!

Our Nursery Rhyme of the Week has been "Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes", which the children have enjoyed joining in with through singing and actions. We have also been busy developing our early writing skills through lots of mark making and building our movement and regulation skills through sensory circuits. It has been a lovely week full of exploration, learning and fun!

This week in Thrive, we have started our new story, Whatever Next! and have been building our understanding of "Who", "What" and "What doing" in our writing.

In Maths, we are looking at Number through building number stairs and have investigated place value with counters.

We have explored crunching and rolling cereal, orange spaghetti, pasta and playdough (we're getting better at making this!) in our Sensory time.

We have explored creating the colour of the week orange in Art and have even made and iced our own shortbread biscuits in Baking.
